
About your trip notes

Day 1 | Fethiye (Turkey) - Boncuklu Bay

Day 3 | Gemiler Bay – Ekincik Bay

Rise and shine! Today we'll be up with the sun (well, almost) to cruise across to Ekincik Bay, our next overnight stop. This spot is tucked at the top of the Dalyan Delta, known for its golden beaches, rock-carved tombs, and sulfur-rich mud baths. Feeling adventurous? Join an optional boat trip upriver to the ancient city of Kaunos—said to have been founded by the grandson of Apollo, the god of music and dance. Sounds like our kind of guy. Then it's time for a dip in Dalyan's famous 'beauty mud'. And this afternoon? Float your worries away with a swim at Iztuzu Beach, where you might even spot a loggerhead turtle.

Here you'll find ancient ruins and calm waters perfect for snorkelling. Tonight, enjoy another delicious dinner with your crew. All in favour? Say aye!

Changing money

Cash: Foreign money can be changed at banks, airports, some railway and tube stations, and at major hotels (though at a less favourable rate).

Credit cards: Visa and MasterCard are widely accepted. American Express is only accepted in some larger establishments.

Cash machines: ATMS are widely available.

Tipping

Basically: it's not necessary.

Your Trip Leader don't expect tips, and they won't ask for any either.
Meaning? More dollar to spend on optional activities (and a souvenir for your nan).

Topdeck app

Locked in your next adventure? It's time to download the Topdeck Travel app and get REAL excited! It's like that organised mate who keeps everything in check, leaving you to enjoy allll the vibes completely hassle-free. Think: a fun trip countdown clock and full access to Your Topdeck Experience (including Local Lowdown Maps featuring awesome local recs for specific cities). Plus, your day-by-day itinerary at your fingertips. Nice!





Will I have regular access to Wi-Fi?

Yup! Most of the places we stay offer free Wi-Fi (except in the middle of the Sahara Desert or while sailing on a felucca down the Nile... obvs).

When you're out and about, most restaurants and cafes will allow you to jump on their Wi-Fi when you order something. Or you can buy your Topdeck eSIM from here and save \$\$\$ on roaming fees. Easy.

Insurance

Before your trip departs, it's compulsory for all passengers to take out comprehensive travel insurance covering cancellation, medical expenses (including repatriation), loss or damage to baggage and personal belongings, money and personal liability.

Passports and visas

Please make sure your passport is valid for at least six months after the last day of your trip. Some countries will refuse entry if you do not have at least six months validity remaining on your passport after your departure date. Depending on your nationality, you may require a visa to enter certain countries.

It is your responsibility to obtain visas prior to your trip's departure. To determine which visas you'll need, you can consult either your own government's website or the government websites of the countries in which you will be travelling.

PLEASE NOTE: some visas can take up to six weeks to acquire, so don't leave it until the last minute. Also, bear in mind that the validity of a visa often runs from its date of issue rather than the date of entry into the country. Please check with the appropriate embassy/embassies prior to departure, as requirements do change periodically.

Mental health and wellbeing

Culture shock, homesickness, random periods of feeling down – these things happen and are totally normal. You can rest assured that if you're feeling low, your Topdeck crew will do their utmost to cheer you up.

Measures you can take to look after your mental health and wellbeing while on the road with us are:

- Call home. Sometimes it's nice to hear a familiar voice and have a good oldfashioned catch up with your loved ones
- Eat well. Never underestimate the power of a good, wholesome meal. Nobody feels at their best when they're hungry!
- Drink responsibly. Not only will you swerve the dreaded hangover, but by keeping an
 eye on what you drink you could also avoid getting into any potentially
 uncomfortable situations
- Talk to your Trip Leader. Don't forget, they're probably far from home too so they're sure to know some tried- and-tested ways to beat the blues
- Integrate with your fellow Topdeckers. This one is key! The more fun you're having on your trip, the less likely you are to feel homesick (fact!)

Night out

We love a good night out – experiencing the nightlife and entertainment places have to offer is a big part of travelling. But alongside the fun it's important to be aware of your surroundings and personal safety.

When you're out late, remember to avoid walking alone – particularly through deserted areas like beaches and back streets. Always stick together, take a registered taxi where possible, and keep a note of your accommodation so you can find your way back to your fellow Topdeckers if you become separated. Make sure you have your trip mates' mobile numbers in case you need to get hold of them while out and about.

In some countries, alcoholic measures can be considerably larger than what you may be used to. Try to keep track of what you're drinking – and if you see one of your trip mates looking a little worse for wear, take them back to your accommodation. Never leave your drink unattended.

It's also important to be aware that what you might consider harmless flirting may be interpreted differently in some countries. Be yourself and have fun, but stay savvy –

you don't want to find yourself in an uncomfortable situation.

Drug use

Topdeck has a strict zero-tolerance drug policy. Customers should not bring any illegal substances onto the Topdeck coach or into any of the accommodation we stay in on our trips. This includes marijuana – even if it is legal in some of the states your trip passes through. If you are found in possession of drugs, you will be removed from the trip immediately. All instances of drug possession will be reported to Topdeck Head Office, who may consider alerting the relevant authorities.

REMEMBER: if you are found in possession of drugs, you risk getting in trouble with the local police.

Respecting fellow travellers

Our trips are for everyone. We're a family – and we want every Topdecker to have an incredible time.

What we're not about is excluding people or making them feel like they don't belong. That's why we always encourage Topdeckers to be kind and courteous to their fellow tripmates. The golden rules? Respect each other's space, be mindful of causing excessive noise in shared accommodation, and treat others how you'd wish to be treated. Easy!

How to be a responsible traveller

Responsible travel isn't difficult to achieve. With a little conscious thought and preparation, you can have an awesome adventure AND a positive impact on the places you visit. Sweet!

Here are five things you can do to ensure you're travelling responsibly:

• Conserve water. You know the drill – reuse your room towels, take short showers and remember to turn off the tap when you're brushing your teeth

- Reduce your waste. Ditch the plastic bag, refuse unnecessary packaging, dispose of your waste responsibly and recycle as much as possible
- Go local. Hunt down locally owned and operated restaurants and bars, shop in local markets, and book tours and activities run by local guides
- Consider the wildlife. Avoid any attractions that involve closely engaging with wild animals
- Respect local people and culture. Obeying local laws is a given but also remember to dress and behave in a manner appropriate to the community. Be polite and keep an open mind!

What to Pack

Based on our experience, these items are key. Everyone's different though – so if you want to bring more or less, go for it (as long as you don't exceed your 20kg allowance, that is!).

Off to Japan? Your luggage must be no bigger than 160cm in total (height x width x length). So maybe leave the hairdryer at home.

Psst: this is a packing list for Topdeck trips in general. Obv you'd look silly splashing around the Greek islands in a snowsuit.

FAQs

Is there air conditioning on the sailboat?

Yes, air conditioning is available on board but will be limited when the boat is sailing. Even more of an excuse to get heaps of that fresh sea air!

How much luggage can I bring?

Storage is limited on the boats, so pack light with a soft backpack or rucksack.

Do I need to tip?

Yes, tipping on a boat tour is standard in Turkish culture, and all our local crew members work tirelessly over the 5-month summer period to ensure all passengers have the best trip possible. If you're happy with the service the crew provides, we encourage the contribution of a small tip (around 300 Lira) for each local crew member. Your Topdeck Sailing Representative will not expect, nor ask for, any tips as per our No Tipping Policy.

Can the weather affect the itinerary?

Yes, this itinerary is subject to change depending on weather and mooring conditions.

What currency will I need?

The currency in Turkey is the Turkish Lira (TRY).

Do I need travel insurance?

Absolutely! It's a requirement that all Topdeckers have comprehensive travel insurance to cover the likes of cancellation, personal injury and medical expenses. You'll be barred from travelling with us without it. It's also super important you read the fine print of the policy you're taking out, so you know exactly what activities you are covered for (looking at you, adrenalin junkies!) and what your excess limits are in cases of emergency – before, during and after your trip. As a rule, you should book your travel insurance at the time of booking your trip.

Do I need a visa?

Obtaining the correct visas for your trip is your own responsibility. Not having correct visas could mean missing out on part (or all) of your trip. Ask your travel agent or check with the appropriate embassies before you depart, remembering that visa requirements can change at short notice.

Please note: For most countries where visas are required, it's NOT possible to obtain a wisa while on the trip. Some visas take 3-4 weeks to obtain – so get on it early!
